Concept Note

'Since wars begin in the minds of men and women, it is in the minds of men and women that the defences of peace must be constructed.' These words form the renowned preamble to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) constitution, which formally declared the establishment of the UNESCO that exists today. UNESCO's founding principles highlight the importance of diversity, tolerance, dialogue, and cooperation, which are particularly apt in our current age of intensifying global division and conflict. Further, the ongoing climate crisis and proliferation of widespread infectious diseases are reminders that our individual lives are intricately linked to, and affected by, the societies and communities around us, as well as the world at large. In light of the above, it is safe to assume that UNESCO's overarching mission to 'contribute to peace and security by promoting cooperation among nations through education, science and culture' is now more pertinent than ever.

The private sector in Japan has had a history of spearheading UNESCO activities, making significant progress in this area relative to its global counterparts. Many organisations in the Japanese private sector thus place emphasis on international cooperation and exchange. This has been demonstrated not only through their frequent interaction and collaboration with developing nations, but also in their support of local communities through the utilisation of natural and cultural resources.
